**Group 10: Towards the G20 Summit and the Democracy Summit**

**31 March 2022, 10:15 AM - 12:00 Noon**

The session will discuss collaboration opportunities to influence the 2022 Indonesian Presidential agenda related to C20-G20, and the Democracy Summit led by the U.S. Government, both of which are planned to take place by the end of 2022.

Indonesia is the host of the 2022 G20. One of the groups involved with the G20 is civil society, C20 (Civil-20). The hope is that the various groups involved will actively contribute to the agenda, including the final statement. However, over the past few years, civil society has failed to include their recommendations. There is great hope that this C20 will change with Indonesia, with its openness and proximity to civil society.

In December 2021, the U.S. Government held its first Democracy Summit online, with 110 countries in attendance. Various issues related to democracy, such as the seizure of power by the military in Myanmar and the assassination of Haiti's president, were hot topics discussed at the summit. Participants in the Democracy Summit are only the countries that embrace democracy as a system of government. China, Russia, North Korea, Vietnam, and so on were not invited to the summit.

Although the summit received criticism, especially from Russia and China, the event was seen as a good thing as a way to properly implement democracy in countries that adhere to a democratic system of government.

The upcoming implementation of Democracy Summit and G20 may discuss the same topics as before. Issues such as the protection of human rights, justice in the handling of pandemics, and the spirit of community participation in democracy to realize the world of inclusion need to be on the agenda.

Guide Questions:

1. What strategic issues in Indonesia contribute to global issues to be discussed at the G20 and the Democracy Summit?
2. What are the key roles and recommendations of civil society with regard to global issues that need to be raised at the upcoming G20 and Democracy Summit?
3. How does cooperation between rich countries support poor countries to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and the recovery of post-pandemic economic conditions?
4. What is the role of the G20 Presidency of Indonesia in achieving vaccine access for 100% of the world's population by 2022 and reforming the global health architecture?
5. What is the role of the G20 Presidency of Indonesia in accelerating the recovery of environmentally friendly and sustainable economic conditions after the Covid-19 pandemic?

6. What is the role of the G20 Presidency of Indonesia in the promotion of public participation and the fulfillment of the rights of women, disabled, elderly and young people in socio-economic development?
7. What is the hope of a Democracy Summit in the promotion of democracy in the world and the strengthening of multilateral approaches in global cooperation?
8. What are the C20 measures in pushing global policy reform through the G20 and other multilateral forums?
